Labour market organisations & collective bargaining

A brief introduction



Employers' organisations

There are approximately 50 employers' organisations in Sweden. They represent employers in different sectors and industries. Most of them are affiliated to Swedish Enterprise.

Swedish Enterprise represents employers' organisations in the private sector

Most Swedish employers' organisations are affiliated to the Confederation of Swedish Enterprise (Swedish Enterprise) (in Swedish, 'Svenskt Näringsliv'). It comprises 48 employers' organisations and business associations in the private sector. Some of the members are both employers' organisations and business associations.

These organisations represent approximately 60,000 businesses, employing a total of 1.8 million people. All businesses affiliated to these member organisations are also members of Swedish Enterprise.

In Sweden, collective agreements on wages and employment conditions are concluded at sector-level. Hence, employers' organisations affiliated to Swedish Enterprise conclude their own agreements on wages and employment conditions. Swedish Enterprise concludes cross-sector agreements (e.g., collective agreements on occupational pensions) on behalf of its members.

Most employers' organisations in the manufacturing industry are also signatories to the Industrial Agreement (Industriavtalet), a cooperation agreement between employer organisations and trade unions in the industrial sector. The collective agreements on wages and employment conditions signed by signatories to the Industrial Agreement act as a cost benchmark for the rest of the labour market.

Some of the employers' organisations affiliated with Swedish Enterprise are also members of the following organisations:

- Almega, which has nine members in the service sector
- Swedish Confederation of Transport Enterprises
 (Transportföretagen), which has seven members in the transport sector.

All employers' organisations affiliated to Swedish Enterprise are listed in the table on the next page.

Other employers' organisations in the private sector

A number of employers' organisations representing employers in the private sector are not affiliated to Swedish Enterprise.

These organisations are listed in the table on the right.

SALAR and SAGE represent public sector employers

All of Sweden's 290 municipalities and 21 regions are members of the Swedish Association of Local Authorities and Regions (SALAR) (in Swedish 'Sveriges Kommuner och Regioner'). Municipalities and regions employ approximately 1.2 million people. SALAR and Sobona, an employers' organisation for municipally owned enterprises, conclude many collective agreements together.

Lastly, the Swedish Agency for Government Employers (SAGE) (in Swedish 'Arbetsgivarverket') concludes collective agreements on behalf of approximately 250 central government agencies and other closely associated organisations. SAGE handles negotiations with trade unions for close to 270,000 employees in the central government sector.

Trade unions

There are approximately 50 trade unions in Sweden. They represent different groups of blue-collar and white-collar employees in different sectors. Most of them are affiliated to one of the three central organisations: LO, TCO and Saco. Collective bargaining is carried out by the unions themselves or through different negotiation organisations such as PTK.

Different unions for blue-collar and white-collar workers

In Sweden, there are distinct trade unions for blue-collar and white-collar employees. Moreover, white-collar employees with academic education also have their own separate unions.

Collective agreements on wages and employment conditions are concluded at sector level. The negotiating parties are one or several trade unions on one side, and an employers' organisation or an employer on the other. As discussed below, trade unions can also participate in collective bargaining through various negotiation organisations.

Collective agreements concerning occupational pensions and other collectively agreed insurance schemes are mainly concluded at cross-sector level, for instance between Swedish Enterprise and the Swedish Trade Union Confederation LO, a central organisation for blue-collar employees.

Most blue-collar workers are organised in LO-affiliated unions

As table 3 on the next page shows, most unions organising blue-collar employees are affiliated with LO. LO represents 13 trade unions that in total organise around 1.4 million blue-collar employees in both the private and the public sectors. With over 500,000 members, the

largest union affiliated to LO is the Swedish Municipal Workers' Union.

LO's member unions conclude their own collective agreements on wages and employment conditions. However, LO has a coordinating role in negotiations regarding wages and employment condition.

Additionally, LO concludes cross-sector collective agreements on occupational pension and other collectively agreed insurance schemes on behalf of its members.

Another important task for LO is to promote the socioeconomic interests of blue-collar employees.



Other bodies

Some LO-affiliated unions are also affiliated to different collaboration bodies:

- The Swedish Unions within Industry is a cooperation platform for those trade unions that are parties to the Industrial Agreement.
- 6F collaborates in areas such as political advocacy, work environment and international affairs.

Trade unions for white-collar employees

Most unions organising white-collar workers are affiliated with either TCO, the Swedish Confederation of Professional Employees or Saco, the Swedish Confederation of Professional Associations.

TCO comprises 12 trade unions representing 1.2 million white-collar employees. With close to 600,000 members, the largest TCO-affiliated union is Unionen.

Saco, the Swedish Confederation of Professional
Associations represents 21 unions organising around 1
million professionals with qualifications from higher
education. The largest Saco-affiliated union is the Swedish
Teachers' Union. It has approximately 300,000 members.

TCO and Saco promote the political and socio-economic interests of white-collar workers in Sweden. They do not participate in collective bargaining.

Collective bargaining is carried out by their member unions at sector-level or through the following negotiation bodies:

- PTK the council for negotiation and cooperation organises 27 unions from TCO and Saco as well as the trade union Ledarna. It concludes cross-sector agreements (e.g. pensions) in the private sector.
- Akademikerförbunden (not included in table 4) is a negotiation platform for trade unions affiliated to Saco.
 It concludes agreements in the private sector in different constellations.
- The Public Employees' Negotiation Council OFR is a negotiation body for 13 trade unions organising employees in the public sector.
- AkademikerAlliansen concludes collective agreements on wages, employment conditions and collectively agreed pension and insurance schemes with its counterparts SALAR and Sobona. All of AkademikerAlliansens' 16 members are Saco-affiliated unions.
- Saco-S is a negotiation body for graduates working for the state. Its 19 member unions are affiliated to Saco.

Furthermore, two white-collar unions (Unionen and Engineers of Sweden) are affiliated to The Swedish Unions within Industry, a cooperation platform for trade unions that are parties to the Industrial Agreement.

Table 4 on the next page lists white-collar workers and their affiliation to TCO, Saco and different negotiations or collaboration bodies.
